CANADA

November landings in the sea-fisheries of Canada totalled 139,026,000 lb., worth \$3,770,000, lower by 13% in volume and 1% in value than the 159,386,000 lb. worth \$3,802,000 reported in November, 1953.

In the first eleven months of 1954 landings amounted to 1,751 million pounds, 8% over the 1,615 million pounds landed in the same period of 1953, whilst the 1954 value, \$77,817,000, exceeded that of 1953, (\$72,825,000), by 7%.

ATLANTIC

The Atlantic Coast landings in November, 60,789,000 lb. valued at \$2,049,000, were higher by 18% and 3% respectively than the 51,508,000 lb. worth \$1,983,000 reported in November, 1953.

During the January-November period, landings totalled 1,234 million pounds and were valued at \$4,267,000, higher by 7% in volume and 5% in value than the comparable 1953 figures of 1,154 million pounds and \$42,974,000.

Although the November landings in New Brunswick were larger than in the same month of 1953, their value was lower by some 5%. However, in the eleven-month period under review, cumulative landings of 196,732,000 lb. and cumulative value, \$6,721,000, were higher than in 1953 by 7% and 3% respectively.

Nova Scotian fishermen experienced a better month than in November, 1953, with most of the major fisheries showing increases; exceptions were lobster, plaice, hake and cusk. For the January-November period both total landings and total value were higher by 3% than in 1953.

PACIFIC

In November landings in British Columbia totalled 78,237,000 lb. and were valued at \$1,721,000. They were, therefore, 28% and 5% lower than the 107,878,000 lb. of fish worth \$1,819,000 landed in November, 1953.

The herring fishery contributed \$848,000, or approximately 50%, and the salmon fishery \$760,000, or 44%, to the total value. Landings of chum salmon amounted to 8,288,000 lb., worth \$725,000.

STOCKS

Holdings of frozen fish at December 1st amounted to 63,524,000 lb., of which 60,895,000 lb. were frozen fresh and 2,629,000 lb. frozen smoked.

EXPORTS

Exports of fish and fish products during the eleven months of 1954 were valued at \$122,208,000 and thus were 16% above last year's level. Increased exports were reported in all categories, except pickled fish and shellfish, both of which were slightly below last year's figures.

CANADA

Les débarquements de poisson de mer au Canada ont été de 139,026,000 livres d'une valeur de \$3,770,000, diminution de 13 p. 100 en volume et de 1 p. 100 en valeur sur les 159,386,000 livres d'une valeur de \$3,802,000 déclarées en novembre 1953.

Au cours des onze premiers mois de 1954, les débarquements se sont chiffrés par 1,751 millions de livres, augmentation de 8 p. 100 sur les 1,615 millions de livres débarquées durant la même période de 1953; d'autre part, la valeur (\$77,817,000) de 1954 surpassé de 7 p. 100 celle de 1953 (\$72,825,000).

ATLANTIQUE

Les débarquements sur la côte de l'Atlantique en novembre (60,789,000 livres) ont atteint une valeur de \$2,049,000, augmentations de 18 et de 3 p. 100 sur les 51,508,000 livres d'une valeur de \$1,983,000 déclarées en 1953.

Durant la période janvier-novembre, les débarquements se sont chiffrés par 1,234 millions de livres d'une valeur de \$4,267,000, augmentation de 7 p. 100 en volume et de 5 p. 100 en valeur sur les chiffres correspondants de 1953 (1,154 millions de livres et \$42,974,000).

Bien que les débarquements de novembre au Nouveau-Brunswick aient été supérieurs à ceux du même mois de 1953, leur valeur a diminué d'environ 5 p. 100. Cependant, pour les onze mois à l'étude, les débarquements (196,732,000 livres) et leur valeur (\$6,721,000) surpassent respectivement de 7 et de 3 p. 100 les chiffres de 1953.

Les pêcheurs de la Nouvelle-Ecosse ont fait de meilleures pêches qu'en novembre 1953, car il y a eu augmentation de la prise de la plupart des espèces; ont fait exception, le homard, le carrelet, la merluche et le brosmius. Durant la période janvier-novembre, les débarquements et la valeur ont surpassé de 3 p. 100 les chiffres de 1953.

PACIFIQUE

En Colombie-Britannique, les débarquements se sont chiffrés par 78,237,000 livres d'une valeur de \$1,721,000. Ils ont en conséquence été inférieur de 28 p. 100 en volume et de 5 p. 100 en valeur à ce qu'ils avaient été en novembre 1953 (107,878,000 livres et \$1,819,000).

La prise de hareng a représenté \$848,000 ou environ 50 p. 100 du total; celle de saumon, \$760,000 ou 44 p. 100. Les débarquements de bécard se sont chiffrés par 8,288,000 livres d'une valeur de \$725,000.

STOCKS

Les stocks de poisson congelé le 1er décembre s'établissaient à 63,524,000 livres, dont 60,895,000 de poisson frais congelé et 2,629,000 de poisson fumé

EXPORTATIONS

Les exportations de poisson et de produits du poisson durant les onze premiers mois de 1954 ont atteint une valeur de \$122,208,000, surpassant ainsi de 16 p. 100 leur niveau de l'an dernier. Il y a eu augmentation de toutes les catégories, à l'exception du poisson mariné et des crustacés, dont les exportations ont légèrement diminué au regard de l'an dernier.
