CANADA

In June the sea-fishermen of Canada (Newfoundland included) caught 184,331,000 pounds of fish worth \$9,746,000 initially, as against 178,391,000 pounds worth \$9,793,000 in June, 1953. Landings, therefore, were 3.3 p.c. heavier, but 0.5 p.c. less valuable than in the same month of last year.

Cumulative figures for the first six months of 1954 were -- with last year's comparable figures and the percentage differences in parentheses -- 645,325,000 pounds (525,263,000 pounds; plus 22.8 p.c.) and \$28,357,000 (\$27,144,000; plus 4.5 p.c.).

ATLANTIC

East Coast landings and landed values were -- again with last year's figures and the percentage differences in brackets -- 170,746,000 pounds (160,255,000 pounds; plus 6.5 p.c.) and \$7,754,000 (\$7,132,000; plus 8.7 p.c.).

For the six-month period under review the catch was 468,479,000 pounds (465,793,000 pounds; plus 0.6 p.c.), whilst the catch value was \$22,131,000 (\$21,859,000; plus 1.2 p.c.). A decrease in the aggregate value of the lobster fishery, caused by lower unit prices, would appear to have been more than offset by larger catches of groundfish.

In Newfoundland total landings and landed values were higher than in 1953, both in June and during the January-June period.

The New Brunswick sardine fishery is still running above last year's level, but the aggregate value of the lobster catch is down by 21.9 p.c.

Nova Scotia landings and landed values -- 48,925,000 pounds and \$2,841,000 -- were 6.7 p.c. smaller, but 0.1 p.c. more valuable than in June, 1953. Lobster prices seem to have declined this month.

PACIFIC

The Pacific Coast catch of 13,585,000 pounds valued at \$1,992,000 was lower in both cases by 25.1 p.c. than in June, 1953. Figures for salmon were down sharply, but it must be remembered that net fishing ceased during the fourth week of the month pending a settlement of price agreements between union and operators.

STOCKS

Holdings of all frozen fish in Canada totalled 39,277,000 pounds, consisting of 36,706,000 pounds frozen fresh and 2,571,000 pounds frozen smoked.

EXPORTS

Exports of fish and fish products during the January-May period of 1954 amounted to \$49,533,000 -- 10.0 p.c. higher than in the same five months of 1953.

CANADA

Au Canada (y compris Terre-Neuve), les débarquements de poissons de mer, en juin, se sont établis à 184,331,000 livres d'une valeur initiale de \$9,746,000 au regard de 178,391,000 livres et de \$9,793,000 en juin 1953. C'est une augmentation de 3.3 p. 100 quant au volume, mais une diminution de 0.5 p. 100 quant à la valeur.

Au cours du premier semestre de 1954, le total cumulatif comparé au chiffre correspondant de l'année dernière (entre parenthèses, la différence de pourcentage) s'est établi respectivement à 645,325,000 livres contre 525,263,000 (+ 22.8 p. 100) et à \$28,357,000 contre \$27,144,000 (+ 4.5 p. 100).

ATLANTIQUE

Sur la côte orientale, les débarquements et leur valeur, comparés aussi à ceux de juin 1953 (entre parenthèses, la différence de pourcentage) se sont chiffrés par 170,746,000 livres en comparaison de 160,255,000 (+ 6.5 p. 100) et par \$7,754,000 comparativement à \$7,132,000 (+ 8.7 p. 100).

Durant le semestre observé, la prise a été de 468,479,000 livres au regard de 465,793,000 (+ 0.6 p. 100) et la valeur, de \$22,131,000 contre \$21,859,000 (+ 1.2 p. 100). La baisse des prix unitaires a fait descendre la valeur totale de la pêche de homard; toutefois, cette perte semble avoir été plus que compensée par la prise accrue de poissons de fond.

A Terre-Neuve, les débarquements et leur valeur ont été supérieurs à ceux de 1953 en juin et pendant la période janvier-juin.

Au Nouveau-Brunswick, la pêche de la sardine l'emporte encore sur celle de l'an dernier, mais la valeur cumulative de la prise de homard est descendue de 21.9 p. 100.

En Nouvelle-Ecosse, les débarquements et leur valeur se sont établis à 48,925,000 livres et à \$2,841,000, diminution et augmentation respectives de 6.7 et de 0.1 p. 100 sur juin 1953. Les prix du homard ont apparemment baissé au cours du mois observé.

PACIFIQUE

Sur la côte du Pacifique, la prise (13,585,000 livres) a été évaluée à \$1,992,000, soit, dans les deux cas, une diminution de 25.1 p. 100 par rapport à juin 1953. Les chiffres enregistrés pour la pêche du saumon ont accusé une forte baisse; mais, à ce sujet, il faut se rappeler que la pêche au filet a cessé durant la quatrième semaine du mois, alors qu'on attendait un accord entre l'union et les exploitants sur les prix.

STOCKS

Les stocks de tous les poissons gelés au Canada ont atteint le total de 39,277,000 livres, dont 36,706,000 livres de poisson frais et 2,571,000 livres de poisson fumé.

EXPORTATIONS

Les exportations de poisson et de produits du poisson, durant la période janvier-mai de 1954, ont été évaluées à \$49,533,000, gain de 10.0 p. 100 sur la valeur correspondante de 1953.
