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CANADIAN FISHERIES - JULY 1954

CANADA

In July the sea-fishermen of Canada (Newfoundland included) caught 343,630,000 pounds of fish worth \$14,460,000 to them, compared to a catch of 337,761,000 pounds valued at \$16,881,000 taken in July 1953. Landings, therefore, were 1.7 p.c. heavier, but 14.3 p.c. lower in value than in the same month of last year.

Landings during the first seven months of 1954 were -- with last year's comparable figures and the percentage differences in parentheses -- 986,590,000 pounds (864,036,000 pounds; plus 14.2 p.c.) and \$42,724,000 (\$44,026,000; minus 3.0 p.c.)

ATLANTIC

East Coast landings and landed values for July were 299,179,000 pounds (281,752,000 pounds; plus 6.2 p.c.) and \$8,628,000 (\$8,138,000; plus 6.0 p.c.).

For the first seven months of this year the catch was 765,293,000 pounds (747,544,000 pounds; plus 2.4 p.c.), whilst the catch value was \$30,667,000 (\$29,998,000; plus 2.2 p.c.). The lobster fishery is still running below last year's level in value, but returns from almost all the other major species are greater.

In Newfoundland landings and landed values were appreciably above last year's figures, both in July and during the seven-month period under review.

The New Brunswick sardine catch continues its marked improvement over last year. The aggregate value of the lobster fishery, \$244,000, is some 3 p.c. lower than in 1953.

Nova Scotia landings and landed values -- 47,045,000 pounds and \$2,080,000 -- were down by 9.9 and 6.1 p.c. respectively from the comparable figures for July of last year. The most notable declines are to be found in the lobster, swordfish and cod fisheries. Landings of rosefish are greater this year.

PACIFIC

The Pacific Coast catch of 44,451,000 pounds worth \$5,832,000 to the fisherman was 20.6 and 33.3 p.c. lower than that taken in July, 1953.

STOCKS

Holdings of all frozen fish in Canada on August 1st amounted to 48,736,000 pounds, consisting of 46,325,000 pounds frozen fresh and 2,411,000 pounds frozen smoked.

EXPORTS

Exports of fish and fish products during the January-June period of 1954 totalled \$60,976,000 -- 9.1 p.c. higher than in the same six months of 1953.

PÊCHERIES CANADIENNES - JUILLET 1954CANADA

Au Canada (y compris Terre-Neuve), les pêcheurs ont pris en juillet 343,630,000 livres de poissons de mer d'une valeur de \$14,460,000, au regard de 337,761,000 livres et de \$16,881,000 en juillet 1953. Les débarquements de juillet ont donc été supérieurs de 1.7 p. 100 à ceux de 1953 et la valeur, inférieure de 14.3 p. 100.

Au cours des sept premiers mois de 1954, les chiffres cumulatifs comparés à ceux de l'année dernière (entre parenthèses, la différence de pourcentage) se sont établis à 986,590,000 livres contre 864,036,000 (+ 14.2 p. 100) et à \$42,724,000 contre \$44,026,000 (-3.0 p. 100).

ATLANTIQUE

Sur la côte orientale, les débarquements et leur valeur ont été respectivement de 299,179,000 livres en comparaison de 281,752,000 (+ 6.2 p. 100) en juillet 1953 et de \$8,128,000 par rapport à \$8,138,000 (+ 6.0 p. 100).

Durant les sept premiers mois de la présente année, la pêche s'est chiffrée par 765,293,000 livres au regard de 747,544,000 (+ 2.4 p. 100) et sa valeur, par \$30,667,000 par rapport à \$29,998,000 (+ 2.2 p. 100). Les recettes de la prise de homard sont demeurées inférieures à celles de l'année précédente, mais le revenu de toutes les autres principales espèces a été plus élevé.

A Terre-Neuve, les débarquements et leur valeur ont largement dépassé ceux de l'année précédente en juillet et durant la période des sept mois.

Au Nouveau-Brunswick, la pêche de la sardine a continué de se développer par rapport à l'année dernière. La valeur cumulative de la prise de homard (\$244,000) est descendue de 3 p. 100 par rapport à 1953.

En Nouvelle-Ecosse, les débarquements et leur valeur (47,045,000 livres et \$2,080,000) sont tombés respectivement de 9.9 et de 6.1 p. 100 au regard de juillet 1953. Les prises de homard, d'espadon et de morue ont accusé les plus fortes diminutions, mais les débarquements de sébaste ont augmenté.

PACIFIQUE

Sur la côte du Pacifique, la prise et sa valeur (44,451,000 livres et \$5,832,000) ont baissé respectivement de 20.6 et de 33.3 p. 100 au regard de juillet 1953.

STOCKS

Les stocks de tous les poissons gelés au Canada, le 1^{er} août, ont atteint le total de 48,736,000 livres, dont 46,325,000 de poisson frais et 2,411,000 de poisson fumé.

EXPORTATIONS

Les exportations de poisson et de produits du poisson, au cours du premier semestre de 1954, ont été évaluées à \$60,976,000, gain de 9.1 p. 100 sur la valeur correspondante de l'année dernière.
