

CANADIAN FISHERIES - SEPTEMBER 1954

CANADA

In September landings in the sea fisheries of Canada totalled 182,435,000 lb. worth \$11,348,000, higher by 3% in terms of weight and 47% in value than the landings of 177,030,000 lb. worth \$7,712,000 taken in September, 1953.

During the first nine months of the year landings totalled 1,433 million pounds, 12% more than the 1,278 million pounds for the same period in 1953, while the comparative 1954 value, \$67,756,000, exceeded the 1953 value, \$63,189,000, by 7%.

ATLANTIC

The Atlantic Coast landings and landed values for September, 1954, were 132,956,000 pounds and \$4,723,000, compared with 119,933,000 pounds and \$3,643,000 for the same month of 1953. This amounted to an increase of 11% in weight and of 29% in value.

During the nine-month period under review landings amounted to 1,107 million pounds and were worth \$41,378,000, 7% and 6% higher respectively than the 1953 figures of 1,039 million pounds and \$38,867,000.

In Nova Scotia the value of landings in general continued on a slightly higher level for the first nine months of this year than for the same period of 1953, up 5% in spite of a decrease of 3% in the value of the lobster landings.

The New Brunswick sardine catch, although slightly lower in volume than in the same nine months of last year, was 40% higher in value.

PACIFIC

In British Columbia monetary returns to the fisherman in September amounted to \$6,625,000, the highest total for any September in the recorded history of our Pacific fisheries. The value of salmon landed amounted to \$6,371,000 and as such constituted more than 96% of the total. Sockeye salmon amounted to \$3,553,000, which was 56% of the total landed value for the month.

STOCKS

Holdings of frozen fish at October 1st amounted to 65,884,000 pounds, of which 63,492,000 pounds were frozen fresh and 2,392,000 pounds frozen smoked.

EXPORTS

Exports of fish and fish products during the nine months of 1954 to the end of September were valued at \$95,218,000, which was 10% higher than in the same period of 1953. Sales of fresh and frozen fillets to the U.S. market are still climbing, but it must be noted that fish blocks are included in this category.

CANADA

Les débarquements de poisson de mer au Canada ont donné en septembre 182,435,000 livres d'une valeur de \$11,348,000, soit une augmentation de 3 p. 100 quant au poids et de 47 p. 100 en valeur au regard de 177,030,000 livres d'une valeur de \$7,712,000 pour septembre 1953.

Durant les neuf premiers mois de l'année, les débarquements ont été de 1,433 millions de livres ou 12 p. 100 de plus qu'en 1953 (1,278 millions); d'autres part, la valeur de 1954, \$67,756,000, surpasse de 7 p. 100 celle de 1953, \$63,189,000.

ATLANTIQUE

Sur la côte de l'Atlantique, les débarquements et leur valeur en septembre 1954 ont été de 132,956,000 livres et de \$4,723,000, contre 119,933,000 livres et \$3,643,000 pour le même mois de 1953, soit une augmentation de 11 p. 100 quant au poids et de 29 p. 100 quant à la valeur.

Durant les neuf premiers mois, les débarquements se sont chiffrés par 1,107 millions de livres et \$41,378,000, soit des avances de 7 et de 6 p. 100 sur les chiffres correspondants de 1953, 1,039 millions de livres et \$38,867,000.

En Nouvelle-Ecosse, durant les neuf premiers mois de l'année, la valeur des débarquements en général est demeurée un peu plus élevée qu'en 1953, de 5 p. 100 malgré une baisse de 3 p. 100 pour le homard.

La prise de sardines au Nouveau-Brunswick, bien que d'un volume un peu moindre que l'an dernier, a vu sa valeur augmenter de 40 p. 100.

PACIFIQUE

En Colombie-Britannique, les recettes des pêcheurs en septembre se sont chiffrées par \$6,625,000, soit le plus haut total jamais atteint pour ce mois. La valeur du saumon débarqué a été de \$6,371,000, soit plus de 96 p. 100 du total. La valeur du saumon sockeye a été de \$3,553,000, ou 56 p. 100 de la valeur totale.

STOCKS

Les stocks de poisson congelé le 1er octobre se chiffraient par 65,884,000 livres, dont 63,492,000 livres de poisson frais et 2,392,000 livres de poisson fumé.

EXPORTATIONS

Les exportations de poisson et de produits du poisson durant les neuf premiers mois ont atteint une valeur de \$95,218,000 en 1954, soit 10 p. 100 de plus qu'en 1953. Les ventes de filets frais et congelés aux marchés américains continuent d'augmenter, mais il faut remarquer que les blocs de poisson entrent dans cette catégorie.
