PULPWOOD PRODUCTION, CONSUMPTION AND INVENTORIES

SEPTEMBER 1962

At the request of several associations this report now contains data regarding wood residue in addition to pulpwood statistics.

Information contained in the following tables is based on retorns from pulp, paper and board mills and from exporters of pulpwood reporting to the Department of Trade and Commerce.

Pulpwood has been converted to a rough (unbarked) cord basis and wood residue to cunits (100 cu. ft. of solid wood) using appropriate conversion factors.

Inventory figures for pulpwood (table 3) cover wood on land or in water storage (roadside, block pile, rivers and lakes, etc.).

The receipts of wood residue shown in table 4 include pulp chips received as such from sawmills and veneer mills, veneer log cores, slabs and edgings, reject lumber, shavings and sawdust.
