## PULPWOOD AND WOOD RESIDUE STATISTICS

Formerly "Pulpwood Production, Consumption and Inventories"

JANUARY 1963

DOMINION BUREAU The importance of wood residue as a source of raw material for the manufacture of wood pulp has increased considerably during the past decade. At the request of both Pulp and Paper and Lumber Associations the Dominion Bureau of Statistics is now collecting more detailed statistics on this material.

The information contained herein on pulpwood and wood residue is based on returns received from the users of these materials for the manufacture of pulp. paper and paperboard. Information on pulpwood production is also collected from exporters of pulpwood reporting to the Department of Trade and Commerce.

In Eastern Canada, the wood-year for reporting companies begins June 1st and at the request of the Canadian Pulp and Paper Association cumulative figures for their wood-year as well as the calendar year are provided. Inventory figures for pulpwood (Table 3) include wood on land and in water storage (roadside, block pile, rivers, lakes, etc.).
