## PULPWOOD AND WOOD RESIDUE STATISTICS

## SEPTEMBER 1965

The data presented for pulpwood and wood residue are compiled from information supplied by domestic pulp and paper mills.

Previously pulpwood for export was incorporated in the figures for product and inventories. However this led to duplication and other difficulties. It is thought that the new presentation is more useful. For comparative purposes the figures for the previous year have been compiled on the new basis.

Export and Import data as reported in Trade of Canada are shown in Tables and 6, Page 4.
