PRELIMINARY REPORT ON COAL PRODUCTION

February, 1960

Coal production during February amounted to 1,013,000 tons making a total production of 2,137,353 tons for the first two months of the year. In comparison with the corresponding month of last year, production showed an increase of 10.0 per cent.

Landed imports of coal during the month amounted to 182,378 tons, making a total of 367,949 tons imported during the first two months of this year. This was a decrease of 43.5 per cent compared with the tonnage imported in the corresponding month of last year.

Data on coal exported during February are not yet available. There were 29,896 tons exported during February, 1959.
