PRELIMINARY REPORT ON COAL PRODUCTION IN CANADA

FEBRUARY, 1948

The strike in the coal mines of Alberta and British Columbia continued during the month of February and reduced the Canadian output to 1,151,000 tons. This output was about equal to the tonnage produced in February of last year when similar conditions prevailed with the strike in New Brunswick and Nova Scotia.

Using the months of February 1946 and December 1947 for comparison, the drop in output for the current month was 30 per cent and 35 per cent respectively.

Imports of coal into Canada during the month amounted to 1,103,281 tons, a decline of 6 per cent compared with February, 1947.

Coal exported during February amounted to 11,369 tons.
