PREJIMINARY REPORT ON COAL PRODUCTION IN CANADA

JANUARY, 1949

Coal production in Canada during January amounted to 1,827,500 tons. In comparison with the corresponding month of last year, production showed an increase of 30.8 per cent.

Imports of coal into Canada during the month amounted to 866,503 tons. This was a decrease of 21.2 per cent compared with the tonnage imported in the corresponding month of last year.

Coal exported during January amounted to 36,933 tons.
