PRELIMINARY REPORT ON COAL PRODUCTION IN CANADA

FEBRUARY, 1949

Coal production in Canada during February amounted to 1,673,500 tons making a total production of 3,501,000 tons for the first two months of the year. In comparison with the corresponding month of last year, production showed an increase of 44.9 per cent.

Imports of coal into Canada during the month amounted to 823,731 tons, making a total of 1,690,234 tons imported during the first two months of this year. This was a decrease of 25.4 per cent compared with the tonnage imported in the corresponding month of last year.

Coal exported during February amounted to 65,648 tons.
