PRELIMINARY REPORT ON COAL PRODUCTION IN CANADA

SEPTEMBER. 1949

Coal production in Canada during September amounted to 1,703,600 tons making a total production of 13,134,300 tons for the first nine months of the year. In comparison with the corresponding month of last year, production showed an increase of 7.9 per cent.

Imports of coal into Canada during the month amounted to 1,772,854 tons, making a total of 16,264,889 tons imported during the first nine months of this year. This was a decrease of 55.5 per cent compared with the tonnage imported in the corresponding month of last year.

Coal exported during September amounted to 23,679 tens.
