

Coal production during December amounted to 1,888,000 tons making a total production of 19,017,884 tons for the year. In comparison with the corresponding month of last year, production showed an increase of 4.0 per cent.

Imports of coal during the month amounted to 1,410,737 tons, making a total of 27,228,803 tons imported during the year. This was a decrease of 7.6 per cent compared with the tonnage imported in the corresponding month of last year.
