PRELIMINARY REPORT ON COAL PRODUCTION

SEPTEMBER. 1950

Coal production during September amounted to 1,495,000 tons making a total production of 13,282,068 tons for the first nine months of the year. In comparison with the corresponding month of last year, production showed a decrease of 14.4 per cent.

Imports of coal during the month amounted to 3,291,691 tons, making a total of 19,687,147 tons imported during the first nine months of this year. This was an increase of 85.6 per cent compared with the tonnage imported in the corresponding month of last year.

Coal exported during September amounted to 24,396 tons.
