PRELIMINARY REPORT ON COAL PRODUCTION

JANUARY. 1951

Coal production during January amounted to 1,945,000 tons. In comparison with the corresponding month of last year, production showed an increase of 7.9 per cent.

Imports of coal during the month amounted to 1,211,666 tons. This was an increase of 91 per cent compared with the tonnage imported in the corresponding month of last year.

Coal exported during January amounted to 18,515 tons, as compared with 27,083 tons exported in January 1950.
