PRELIMINARY REPORT ON COAL PRODUCTION

FEBRUARY, 1951

Coal production during February amounted to 1,640,000 tons making a total production of 3,585,000 tons for the first two months of the year. In comparison with the corresponding month of last year, production showed a decrease of 7.6 per cent.

Imports of coal during the month amounted to 907,661 tons, making a total of 2,119,327 tons imported during the first two months of this year. This was an increase of 151.1 per cent compared with the tonnage imported in the corresponding month of last year.

Coal exported during February amounted to 13,450 tons, as compared with 37,636 tons exported in February 1950.
