PRELIMINARY REPORT ON COAL PRODUCTION

JULY. 1951

Coal production during July amounted to 1,085,000 tons making a total production of 10,164,544 tons for the first seven months of the year. In comparison with the corresponding month of last year, production showed a decrease of 4.6 per cent.

Imports of coal during the month amounted to 2,523,690 tons, making a total of 14,061,015 tons imported during the first seven months of this year. This was a decrease of 13.3 per cent compared with the tonnage imported in the corresponding month of last year.

Coal exported during July amounted to 26,756 tons, as compared with 16,008 tons exported in July 1950.
