per yearPRELIMINARY REPORT ON COAL PRODUCTIONSEPTEMBER, 1951

Coal production during September amounted to 1,470,595 tons making a total production of 12,857,415 tons for the first nine months of the year. In comparison with the corresponding month of last year, production showed a decrease of 2.9 per cent.

Imports of coal during the month amounted to 2,668,995 tons, making a total of 19,877,670 tons imported during the first nine months of this year. This was a decrease of 18.9 per cent compared with the tonnage imported in the corresponding month of last year.
