PRELIMINARY REPORT ON COAL PRODUCTION

JANUARY - 1952

Coal production during January amounted to 1,960,000 tons. In comparison with the corresponding month of last year, production showed an increase of 1.3 per cent.

Imports of coal during the month amounted to 1,009,515 tons. This was a decrease of 16.6 per cent compared with the tonnage imported in the corresponding month of last year.

Coal exported during January amounted to 52,046 tons, as compared with 18,515 tons exported in January, 1951.
