PRELIMINARY REPORT ON COAL PRODUCTION

Coal production during January amounted to 1,605,000 tons. In comparison with the corresponding month of last year, production showed a decrease of 10.3 per cent.

Landed imports of coal during the month amounted to 598,236 tons. This was a decrease of 24.0 per cent compared with the tonnage imported in the corresponding month of last year.

Coal exported during January amounted to 16,625 tons, as compared with 28,836 tons exported in January, 1953.
