COPPER AND NICKEL PRODUCTION IN CANADA, JUNE AND JULY, 1933.

COPPER - Canadian producers reported an output of 25,265,798 pounds of copper in June and 29,468,497 pounds in July, according to a statement just issued by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics at Ottawa. In the corresponding months of 1932, the outputs were 20,748,711 pounds and 18,145,271 pounds, respectively. Blister copper production in June, 1933, totalled 22,396,308 pounds and in July, 25,974,120 pounds. During the first seven months of 1933 Canada produced 157,391,307 pounds of copper as compared with 148,471,399 pounds a year ago.

Quotations on the New York market for electrolytic copper (for domestic use) in June remained firm at 7.775 cents per pound; in July prices advanced to 8.775 cents per pound with an average for the month of 8.635 cents per pound. Electrolytic copper for export from the United States averaged 7.484 cents per pound in June, ranging from a low of 7.125 cents per pound on the seventeenth to a closing high of 7.725 cents per pound; the July quotations averaged 8.446 cents per pound. The London price (in Canadian funds) for electrolytic copper rose to an average of 8.4467 cents per pound in June and to 9.1508 cents per pound in July; valued at these prices the Canadian output in the former month was worth \$2,134,126 and in the latter, \$2,696,603.

According to the Metal and Mineral Markets the world production of refined copper in June amounted to 85,500 tons and in July to 91,700 tons; deliveries during the two months were 111,100 tons and 110,800 tons, respectively. World stocks of refined copper were estimated at 673,250 tons on July 31st, a 5.3 per cent decline from the tonnage on hand on June 30th.

On July 17th, the Phelps Dodge smelter in Douglas, Arizona, re-opened thus bringing this company's output to 20 per cent of rated capacity or 3,000 tons per month.

NICKEL - Nickel production in Canada during June and July advanced considerably over the totals for the corresponding months of 1932. The June production amounted to 8,050,726 pounds and the July, 9,237,576 pounds, the highest monthly outputs on record since May, 1931. During the seven months ending July the Canadian output of nickel totalled 31,954,937 pounds or 32.7 per cent above the production in the corresponding period of last year.

Exports of nickel in ore, matte or speiss in June were recorded at 4,204,200 pounds; in July, 3,888,300 pounds were exported. Nickel, fine, exportations have shown a steady rise since February and amounted to 5,723,600 pounds in June and 6,245,300 pounds in July. Nickel oxide exports in June were reported at 575,700 pounds and in July at 367,500 pounds.
