COPPER AND NICKEL PRODUCTION IN CANADA, AUGUST, 1933.

COPPER - The Dominion Bureau of Statistics at Ottawa reports that the production of copper in Canada during August amounted to 28,099,702 pounds as compared with 29,468,497 pounds in the preceding month and 17,666,618 pounds in August, 1932. During the first eight months of 1933 Canada produced 185,491,009 pounds of copper; in the corresponding period of 1932 the output totalled 166,138,017 pounds. Blister copper production declined to 24,513,037 pounds from the July total of 25,974,120 pounds.

Daily quotations on the New York market for electrolytic copper for domestic consumption showed little variation in August; the average for the month was 8,768 cents per pound. The July average was 8.635 cents per pound. Electrolytic copper for export from the United States averaged 7.937 cents per pound as against 8.446 cents per pound in July. On the London market quotations averaged 8.5967 cents per pound (in Canadian funds); based on this valuation the total Canadian output in August was worth \$2,415,647.

According to the Metal and Mineral Markets the world production of refined copper totalled 96,000 tons made up of 32,500 tons from the United States and 63,500 tons from other countries. Shipments during the month amounted to 102,500 tons, as a result world stocks on hand at the end of August declined 3.0 per cent to 653,000 tons. In Great Britain, stocks of refined copper in the official Metal Exchange warehouses at the end of the month were recorded at 29,665 tons and rough copper at 8,669 tons. At the end of July the stocks were 28,698 tons and 7,968 tons, respectively.


The Metal and Mineral Markets states that on August 17th, copper producers in the United States filed their code of fair practice with the National Recovery Administration. The code provides for a maximum work week for labour of 40 hours or 8 hours a day, averaged over three months, and includes a plan for/allocation of output by the producing groups and the sales price of copper.

NICKEL - Canada produced 10,197,430 pounds of nickel in August as compared with 9,237,576 pounds in July and 839,119 pounds in August, 1932. The total output during the eight months ending August amounted to 42,152,367 pounds; in the corresponding period of 1932 the total was 24,921,730 pounds.

Nickel in ore, matte or speiss exported from Canada in August totalled 4,300,100 pounds; in July 3,888,300 pounds were exported. Exports of nickel, fine, were recorded at 3,515,300 pounds as against 6,245,300 pounds in the preceding month. Nickel oxide exportations advanced to 628,400 pounds from the July total of 367,500 pounds.
