COPPER AND NICKEL PRODUCTION IN CANADA - FEBRUARY, 1935.

COPPER - Canada's copper production during February was recorded at 33,467,044 pounds as compared with 33,480,418 pounds in January and 24,515,502 pounds in February, 1934, according to a report just issued by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics at Ottawa. During the first two months of 1935 the Canadian output totalled 66,947,462 pounds or 31.2 per cent above the production in the corresponding period of 1934. Blister copper produced in Canada during January and February reached a total of 62,071,958 pounds as against 44,905,250 pounds a year ago.

On the London market quotations for electrolytic copper averaged 6.593326 cents per pound in Canadian funds; valued at this price the Canadian output during February was worth \$2,206,591. During the preceding month the average price was 6.8202 cents per pound and the month's production was valued at \$2,283,431.

Stocks of refined copper in the United States declined to 328,500 tons during February from the January 31st total of 339,250 tons. World stocks, other than those held in the United States, increased 2,000 tons in February to 251,000 tons. London Metal Exchange official warehouses contained 56,605 tons of refined copper and 13,079 tons of rough copper on February 28th as compared with 53,910 tons of refined and 13,377 tons of rough on January 31st.


