COPPER AND NICKEL PRODUCTION IN CANADA - MAY, 1935.

COPPER - The Canadian production of copper during May amounted to 35,772,440 pounds according to a report just issued by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics at Ottawa. In April 38,847,833 pounds were produced and in May, 1934, the output was 35,680,539 pounds. Output during the first five months of 1935 totalled 179,396,641 pounds, a 20.2 per cent increase over the production in the corresponding months of 1934. Blister copper production during the five months ending May was recorded at 165,681,971 pounds as against 152,946,020 pounds during the period January to May, 1934.

Electrolytic copper averaged 8,028456 cents per pound on the London market during May as compared with 7.54574 cents per pound in April. Computed on the basis of these average prices the Canadian output in May was worth \$2,871,975 and in April, \$2,931,356.

Refined copper production of the world in May was estimated at 125,500 tons as compared with 132,900 tons in April. The May output included 48,000 tons from the United States.

World stocks of refined copper on May 31st totalled 582,000 tons made up of 279,000 tons in the United States and 303,000 tons in other countries. On April 30th stocks amounted to 585,500 tons of which 282,000 tons were held in the United States and 303,500 tons in other countries. At the end of May, the London Metal Exchange official warehouses contained 74,430 tons of refined copper and 12,665 tons of rough copper; on April 30th 72,809 tons of refined and 13,534 tons of rough were on hand.

Exports of refined copper from the United States during May declined 42 per cent to 14,303 tons from the April total of 24,674 tons. Japan, Great Britain, France, Italy and Germany were the principal purchasers of the May exports.

Imports of copper into Germany during May were recorded at 19,274 tons as against 13,420 tons in the preceding month and 26,311 tons in May, 1934. British South Africa supplied 35.6 per cent of the May, 1935, German imports. Receipts from Canada during the month amounted to 133 tons. Germany's refinery production in May totalled 17,499 tons; in April 16,002 tons were produced.
