## COPPER AND NICKEL PRODUCTION IN CANADA - JULY, 1935.

COPPER - Canadian producers reported an output of 30,965,129 pounds in July; during June 35,613,851 pounds were produced while in July, 1934, the production was 29,456,597 pounds, according to a report just issued by the Mominion Bureau of Statistics at Ottawa. The output during the seven months ending July totalled 245,975,621 pounds as compared with 206,102,472 pounds in the corresponding period of 1934. Blister copper production in July declined to 29,161,087 pounds from the June total of 31,810,883 pounds.

On the London market electrolytic copper quotations averaged 7,59768 cents per pound in Canadian funds; valued at this price the Canadian output during the month was worth \$2,352,631. The June average price was 7.51077 cents per pound and the value of the month's output was \$2,674,874.

The world production of refined copper in July amounted to 124,500 tons as compared with 120,700 tons in the preceding month. The United States production in July totalled 38,500 tons; in June, 37,900 tons were produced.

World stocks of refined copper on July 31st were made up of 263,300 tons held in the United States and 308,000 tons held in other countries. On June 30th United States stocks totalled 273,300 tons and stocks in other countries, 308,200 tons. Refined copper stocks in the London Metal Exchange official warehouses on July 31st totalled 82,089 tons, in addition 12,694 tons of rough copper were on hand. Stocks in the warehouses at the end of June consisted of 77,560 tons of refined and 12,666 tons of rough copper.

Exports of refined copper from the United States during July rose to 24,727 tons from the June total of 24,143 tons. Japan, Great Britain, Italy, Germany and France were the principal importers of refined copper from the United States in July.


Great Britain imported 98,388 tons of electrolytic copper and 111,367 tons of other unwrought copper during the first seven months of 1935 as compared with 63,325 tons of the former and 78,649 tons of the latter in the corresponding period of 1934. The 1935 importations of electrolytic copper were drawn principally from the following countries: Canada, 39.7 per cent; the United States, 37.1 per cent, and Chile, 10.8 per cent. Other unwrought copper, including rough copper of 94 per cent copper content or over, importations were obtained in the main part from Chile and Northern Rhodesia, the former country supplying 57.9 per cent, and the latter, 36.4 per cent.
