## MONTHLY REPORT

## COPPER AND NICKEL PRODUCTION IN CANADA - MARCH, 1936.

COPPER - Copper production in Canada during March was recorded at 36,478,815 pounds as compared with 32,911,842 pounds in the preceding month and 37,828,906 pounds in March, 1935, according to a report just released by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics at Ottawa. The output during the first quarter of 1936 totalled 103,680,291 pounds; in the corresponding period of the previous year, 104,776,368 pounds were produced.

Electrolytic copper quotations on the London market in March averaged 8.94027 cents per pound, in Canadian funds; valued at this price the Canadian output during the month was worth \$3,261,305. The February average price was 8.7981 cents per pound and the computed value of the month's output was \$2,895,617.

The world production of refined copper in March rose to 138,934 tons from the February total of 131,556 tons. The United States produced 67,044 tons of refined copper as against 54,451 tons in February and stocks at the end of March totalled 238,601 tons or an increase of 8,309 tons during the month. Production in countries other than the United States declined 5,215 tons in March to 71,890 tons; stocks on hand on March 31st were 6,363 tons lower at 244,695 tons. Official warehouses of the London Metal Exchange contained 74,120 tons of refined copper and 8,206 tons of rough copper at the end of March as compared with 79,718 tons of the former and 8,782 tons of the latter on hand on February 29th.

The United States exported 15,744 tons of refined copper, including bonded metal, in March as against 18,456 tons in the preceding month. The March exports were consigned to the following countries: Japan, 4,509 tons; Germany, 3,132 tons; Italy, 2,866 tons; France, 1,438 tons; Great Britain, 1,093 tons; Sweden, 1,065 tons and other countries, 1,641 tons.

Great Britain imported 29,959 tons of electrolytic copper in the first quarter of 1936; Canada supplied 62.0 per cent of these imports, other British countries, 18.3 per cent; the United States, 13.7 per cent; Chile, 4.7 per cent; and other foreign countries, 1.3 per cent. Other unwrought copper imports during January, February and March amounted to 26,192 tons of which Chile supplied 40.7 per cent and Northern Rhodesia, 40.1 per cent.

NICKEL - The Canadian production of nickel in March maintained the high monthly level set up during the past year. Output during the month, amounted to 15,666,457 pounds as compared with 16,151,374 pounds in February and 10,618,462 pounds in March, 1935. During the first quarter of the current year 45,870,533 pounds of nickel were produced in Canada; in the corresponding period of 1935 the output totalled 28,799,895 pounds.
