MONTHLY REPORT

COPPER AND NICKEL PRODUCTION IN CANADA - August, 1937.

Copper - Copper production in Canada set up a new high monthly record in August when 44,583,629 pounds were produced according to a statement just issued by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics at Ottawa. In July, 41,710,830 pounds were produced while in August, 1936 the output was 35,438,299 pounds. During the first eight months of the current year, Canada produced 329,899,425 pounds of copper; this represented an advance of 22.4 per cent over the output in the corresponding period of 1936.

The Sherritt-Gordon mine in Manitoba commenced shipments of copper concentrates to the Flin Flon smelter in August. During the preceding month, the Waite-Amulet mine in Quebec began shipping concentrates to the Noranda smelter and the Copper Mountain property of the Granby Consolidated Mining, Smelting and Power Company, which was re-opened in May, started shipping copper concentrates to Japan.

The average price of electrolytic copper on the London market in August was 14.146 cents per pound; valued at this price, the Canadian output during the month was worth \$6,306,800. In July, copper averaged 13,956 cents per pound and the value of the month's production was \$5,821,163.

Refined copper production of the world declined to 185,680 tons in August from the July total of 193,271 tons. The United States output rose 524 tons to 80,135 tons in August; domestic deliveries during the month amounted to 68,019 tons and exports, to 6,373 tons. Stocks in the United States totalled 123,484 tons on August 31st; at the beginning of the month, 117,741 tons were on hand. In spite of the fact that production in other countries declined 8,115 tons in August to 105,545 tons, stocks in these countries increased 9,753 tons during the month to 205,127 tons.

Imports of electrolytic copper into Great Britain during the eight months ending August amounted to 133,750 tons, made up of 71,110 tons from Canada, 13,192 tons from other British countries, 37,034 tons from the United States and 12,414 tons from other foreign countries. Receipts of other unwrought copper during the same period totalled 148,444 tons and included 72,051 tons from Chile and 56,653 tons from Northern Rhodesia.

Exports of refined copper from the United States in August declined to 22,294 tons from the July total of 29,046 tons. The August exportations consisted of 7,694 tons to Japan, 5,054 tons to Great Britain, 2,604 tons to Germany, 1,869 tons to France, 1,166 tons to Belgium, 1,082 tons to Sweden and 2,825 tons to other countries.

Nickel - The Canadian production of nickel in August advanced to 20,662,233 pounds from the preceding month's total of 15,792,349 pounds and the August, 1936 output of 12,379,095 pounds. Production during the first eight months of 1937 totalled 147,840,919 pounds as compared with 107,927,120 pounds, a year ago.
