MONTHLY REPORT

COPPER and NICKEL PRODUCTION IN CANADA - OCIOBER, 1938.

<u>COPPER</u> - Copper production in Ganada during October amounted to 49,356,139 pounds; in September, 50,238,306 pounds were produced while in October, 1937, the output totalled 51,915,082 pounds, according to a report just issued by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics at Ottawa. An increase of 14.1 per cent was recorded in the output during the first ten months of 1938 compared with the production for the corresponding period a year ago; the totals were 400,572,600 pounds and 430,012,972 pounds, respectively. Blister copper output in October advanced to 43,931,940 pounds from the September total of 41,988,101 pounds.


Copper quotations on the London market, in October, averaged 11.002 cents per pound, in Canadian funds; valued at this price the output in Canada during the month was worth \$5,430,162. The September average price was 10.184 cents per pound and the value of the month's output was \$5,116,269.

The world production of refined copper rose to 167,225 tons in October; the September output was 153,865 tons. The United States output totalled 56,824 tons while domestic shipments and exports of duty-free copper amounted to 82,605 tons with the result that stocks on hand declined 25,781 tons during the month to 267,299 tons. Production in countries other than the United States increased 2,844 tons to 110,401 tons; deliveries advanced to 130,141 tons (including 12,778 tons received from the United States), therefore stocks on October 31st were 6,962 tons lower at 157,412 tons. The London Metal Exchange official warehouses contained 5,170 tons of refined copper and 28,504 tons of rough copper on October 29th compared with 6,526 tons of the former and 32,687 tons of the latter on hand at the beginning of the month.

Exports of refined copper from the United States amounted to 33,427 tons, made up of 13,044 tons shipped to Japan, 8,998 tons to Germany, 2,157 tons to Sweden, 1,954 tons to Italy, 1,775 tons to Poland and Danzig, 1,586 tons to France, 1,263 tons to Great Britain, and 2,670 tons to other countries. In the United States the Hayden smelter in Aritona was reopened recently; the Tooele smelter of the International Smelting & Refining Company will reopen early next month and the Mountain City Copper Company resumes operations on November 1st.

The Engineering and Mining Journal Metal and Mineral Markets refers to the following announcement in London:

"The group participating in the foreign control plan announced on October 10th that the production of copper by its members would be raised 10 per cent to 105 per cent of the basic tonnages, effective October 15th. On October 17th, action was taken by the Cartel to remove all output restrictions, retroactive to October 15th. The initial step to increase production had little or no influence on traders in London, particularly the speculative element. Favourable Soptember statistics, uncovering a substantial reduction in total stocks, brought out renewed activity in the market and higher prices."


