HONTHLY REPORT

COPPER AND NICKEL PRODUCTION IN CANADA - MARCH, 1938.

COPPER - Copper production in Canada during March advanced to 48,089,283 pounds from the preceding month's total of 46,835,955 pounds and the March, 1937, output of 41,796,786 pounds, according to a report just issued by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics at Ottawa. During the first three months of the current year, 147,579,375 pounds were produced compared with 117,504,602 pounds a year ago. Blister copper production in March was recorded at 41,956,487 pounds; in February, 38,795,413 pounds were produced.

Quotations for copper on the London market in March averaged 9.725 cents per pound in Canadian funds; valued at this price the Canadian output during the month was worth (4,674,226. The average price in February was 9.756 cents per pound and the value of the month's production was (4,569,316.

The world production of refined copper in March rose to 189,821 tons from the February output of 161,350 tons. In the United States, production amounted to 61,117 tons or 1,724 tons above the February total; deliveries to customers and exports of domestic copper totalled 44,576 tons, therefore, stocks increased 16,541 tons during the month to 342,735 tons. In countries other than the United States there was an increase of 6,747 tons in production to 108,704 tons but deliveries to customers were higher at 125,269 tons with the result that stocks recorded a decline of 6,142 tons to 197,467 tons.

NICKEL - Nickel production in Canada during March amounted to 17,298,393 pounds compared with 16,008,523 pounds in the preceding month and 18,195,641 pounds in March, 1937. Output during the first quarter of 1938 totalled 53,577,801 pounds or 3.6 per cent above the production a year ago.

The Falconbridge Nickel Mines Ltd. report for the first quarter of 1933 shows that this company treated 118,408 tons of ore and produced 3,902,730 pounds of nickel in matte and 1,964,803 pounds of copper in matte. In the corresponding period of 1937 the nickel production was 5,502,717 pounds and copper, 1,669,092 pounds.
