

Coppys $\rightarrow$ Oopper production in Canada duaing July amounted to 49,607,247 pounds compared with $48,489,958$ pounds in Tune and $41,750,472$ nouncs in iuly, 1937 according to a statement just issued by the Doninion Buroar of Statistics at Ottawa。 During the seven monthe exding July $342,656,104$ pounds vere procuaced or 19.7 per cent above the output a year ago. 3lister coppes proaution in ju1\% rose to $41,415,83$, pounds from the preceding month's total of $40,795,806$ pourds.

The average price of copper on the London aurket in ciuly was 9.846 cents per pound 2a Canadian funas; based on tins price the canadan output during the month was worth $\$ 4,884,330$. Qu0tations during June averaged 8.832 cents por pound and the value of the month's produetion mas compriteri at $\$ 4$, "灾 2,6330

The morid output of resitice copper in Tuly was estimatod at 139,483 tons; in the previous month 2 42,532 tons were produced. Cutput in the Uuited States in July amounted to 35,596 tons mhile domestic deliveries and exports totalled 54,597 tons with the resul.t that stocks decreased 29,001 tons during the month to 339,970 tonï. In countries other than the United States a declene $2 \times$ production of $6,: 30$ tons mog racorded; the month's output was 103: 58? tons and datveries cotalled 113,185 with a consequent docline in stocks of 9,298 tons to 185,226 tons.

Refined copper (foretgi, refined in boid, end dumestic) exported from the United States in July adranced to 39,093 tons from the wiv towal or 28.732 tons. The July exports were comsignod to sho Lollowing countrios; Czechuslovakis, 12,965 tons, Japan, 5,718 tons, Germany, 5,254 tons. Sweden, 3,338 tons. Italy, 2,594 tons, France, 2, 467 tons, Poland and Laizig, 1.906 oons, the Netherlands, 1.529 tons anc other countries, 3,322 tons.

NICKEI- The Canadian output of nickel in July rose to $17,404,131$ pounds from the previous month's production of $16,327,169$ pounds and the July, 1937 total of 15, 795,714 pounds. During the first seven months of 1938 Canada produced $126,399,272$ pounds of nickel compared with $127,279,412$ pounds in the corresponding period of 1937.
