### MONTHLY REPORT

COPPER and NICKEL PRODUCTION IN CAMADA - JULY, 1938.

PROPURTY OF THE LIBRARY.

COPPER - Copper production in Canada during July amounted to 49,607,247 pounds compared with 48,489,958 pounds in June and 41,750,471 pounds in July, 1937 according to a statement just issued by the Dominion Bursau of Statistics at Ottawa. During the seven months ending July 341,656,164 pounds were produced or 19.7 per cent above the output a year ago. Blister copper production in July rose to 41,415,831 pounds from the preceding month's total of 40,795,806 pounds.

The average price of copper on the London market in July was 9.846 cents per pound in Canadian funds; based on this price the Canadian output during the month was worth \$4,884,330. Quotations during June averaged 8.832 cents per pound and the value of the month's production was computed at \$4,282,633.


The world output of refined copper in July was estimated at 139,483 tons; in the previous month 142,532 tons were produced. Cutput in the United States in July amounted to 35,596 tons while demestic deliveries and exports totalled 54,597 tons with the result that stocks decreased 19,001 tons during the month to 339,970 tons. In countries other than the United States a decline in production of 5,180 tons was recorded; the month's output was 103,887 tons and deliveries totalled 113,185 with a consequent decline in stocks of 9,298 tons to 183,226 tons.

Refined copper (foreign, refined in bond, and domestic) exported from the United States in July advanced to 39,093 tons from the June total of 28,732 tons. The July exports were consigned to the following countries; Czechoslovakis, 12,965 tons, Japan, 5,718 tons, Germany, 5,254 tons, Sweden, 3,338 tons, Italy, 2,594 tons, France, 2,467 tons, Poland and Panzig, 1,906 tons, the Netherlands, 1,529 tons and other countries, 3,322 tons.


