GOLD PRODUCTION IN CANADA, NOVEMBER, 1931.

Canada's gold production in November, valued at the standard rate of \$20.671834, was worth \$4,837,416, according to a report issued by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics at Ottawa. The total cutput during the month was 234,010 ounces, a decrease of 1.8 per cent from the October total of 238,397 ounces but an advance of 18.4 per cent over the November, 1930, output of 197,688 ounces. Ontario mines, during the month under review, produced 177,954 ounces of which Kirkland Lake contributed 94,053 ounces, the Porcupine area, 76,158 ounces, and other sources, 7,743 ounces. Ontario's output was valued at \$3,678,636, exclusive of exchange. March, McIntyre, Minto, Parkhill, Sylvanite and Wright-Hargreaves reported increased production during the month. Quebec produced 26,057 ounces as against 25,783 ounces in October; British Columbia, 14,927 ounces as compared with 14,789 ounces last month; Manitoba, 8,897 ounces as against 9,476 ounces in October; the Yukon and Nova Scotia produced the remainder.

The first eleven months of 1931 set up a new high record in Canadian gold production when 2,435,296 ounces were extracted. This total was 29.4 per cent higher than the aggregate for the corresponding months of last year and in fact it was 15.9 per cent in excess of the 1930 calendar year output.
