## GOID PRODUCTION IN CANADA, JANUARY, 1932.

Canadian gold producers reported a production of 233,826 curces valued at \$\\^4,835,612\$ in January as compared with 240,622 curces at \$\\^4,974,098\$ in December and 202,351 curces worth \$\\^4,182,966\$ in January last year, according to a statement issued by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics at Ottawa. During January, Ontario mines produced 179,932 curces, made up of 96,145 curces from the Kirkland Lake area, 75,813 curces from the Porcupine area, and 7,976 curces from other sources. Coniaurum, Howey, Teck-Hughes, Vipond and Wright-Hargreaves reported increased production during the month. Queboc's cutput of 31,078 curces was 53.4 per cent above the total for the corresponding month of 1931. In British Columbia, 12,607 curces were produced as against 11,048 curces in January, 1931. Output in Manitoba totalled 10,117 curces, in the Yukon, 53 curces, and in Nova Scotia, 39 curces.

The Transvaal gold production in January totalled 936,784 ounces of which the Witwatersrand mines produced 890,668 ounces. In January, 1931, the total Transvaal output was 914,576 ounces.
