## GOID PHOLUCIION IN CANADA, NOVEMBEF, 1932.

Gold production in Canada during November totalled 252,517 ounces valued at $\$ 5,219,990$; in the preceaing month 253,057 ounces worth $\$ 5,385,798$ were produced and in November, 1931, the output was 238,5 ounces at $\$ 4,927,214$, according to a report issued by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics at Ottawa. Production during the deven months ending November amounted to $2,777,416$ ounces as compared with $2,452,459$ ounces produced in the corresponding perind of 1931 .

Ontario operators reported an output of 192,634 ounces in November, made up of 92,807 ounces from the Kirkland Lake: area, 88,650 ounces from the Porcupine camp, and 11,177 ounces from other sources. Barry-Hollinger, Dome, MoIntyre, Mcss, Parkhill, Teck-Hughes, Toburn and Vipond reported increased outputs over October. This month's total inoludes the first shipments from the ashley mine in the Nietachewan area. Shipments from the Munro-Croesus are included for the first time since September, 1931. The Triple Lake mine made a small shipment in November, the first since fugust, 1932.

Quebec produced 27,799 ounces of gold in November as compared with 29,269 ounces in the preceding month.

Output from British Columbia, Nanitoba, the Yukon, Nova Scotia, and Alberta totalled 32,084 cunces; during October these provinces produced 31,919 ounces.

The world fuld production in November was estimated by the American Bureau of Metal Statistics at 2,020,000 ounces as compared with 2,033,000 ounces in October. World output during the eleven months ending November aggregated $21,523,000$ ounces, of which the Transvaal produced 49.2 per cent, Canada 12.9 per cent, the United States li.6 per cent, and Russia 6.9 per cent. Transval's production amounted to 578,716 ounces as against 974,965 ounces in October and 900,510 ounces in November, 1931. The United States output (including the Philippines). In November declined to 235,000 ounces from the October total of 255,000 ounces. This falling-off was due principally to seasonal conditions.
