GOLD PRODUCTION IN CANADA, FEBRUARY, 1932.

The Dominion Bureau of Statistics' latest report shows that Canada's production of gold in February was 225,891 ounces as compared with 233,826 ounces in January and 195,113 ounces in February, 1931.

During the month under review, Ontario's production totalled 174,782 ounces, consisting of 87,730 ounces from the Kirkland Lake area, 80,910 ounces from the Porcupine area, and 6,142 ounces from other sources. Increases were recorded in the production of gold by Dome, Hollinger, Kirkland Lake, McIntyre, Minto and Parkhill.

Quebec's output continued at a high level amounting to 29,989 ounces or 71.8 per cent above the February, 1931 total. Production in British Columbia amounted to 11,809 ounces as compared with 11,233 ounces in the corresponding month of 1931. Manitoba producers reported an output of 9,127 ounces; in February last year 9,238 ounces were produced. Operations in the Yukon and Nova Scotia yielded 184 ounces.

Gold production in the Transvaal during February totalled 914,012 ounces; in January, 936,784 ounces were produced. During the first two months of the current year Transvael mines produced 1,850,796 ounces or 5.5 per cent above the total for January and February, 1931.
