## GOLD PRODUCTION IN CANADA, MARCH, 1934.

Canada produced 249,310 ounces of gold in March as compared with 222,937 ounces in February and 260,154 ounces in March, 1933, according to a report issued by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics at Ottawa. Production during the first quarter of 1934 totalled 703,555 ounces or 2.5 per cent below the output in the corresponding months of 1933.

Ontario's output in March advanced to 176,390 ounces consisting of 86,912 ounces from the Kirkland Lake area, 78,226 ounces from the Porcupine camp and 11,252 ounces from other sources. The February production totalled 164,434 ounces made up of 77,053 ounces from Porcupine, 77,014 ounces from Kirkland Lake and 10,367 ounces from other sources. Gold mining companies milled 518,588 tons of ore as compared with 463,619 tons in February and 461,904 tons in March, 1933.

Quebec produced 37,883 cunces of gold in March; during the preceding month 32,977 tons were produced.

An increase of 30.1 per cent was recorded in British Columbia's output in March; the month's production was 23,273 ounces as against 17,894 ounces in February.

Gold production in Manitoba and Saskatchewan reached a total of 11,276 ounces in March, an advance of 48.7 per cent over the February output of 7,583 ounces.

Nova Scotia, Alberta and the Yukon produced 488 ounces of gold in March; during the previous month 49 ounces were produced.

The Royal Canadian Mint received jewellery and scrap containing 31,266 ounces of gold in March as compared with 18,105 ounces contained in the February receipts.

Quotations for gold on the New York market in Canadian funds on March 1st were recorded at \$35.24 per ounce; this was the high mark for the month. On the twenty-ninth and thirty-first the low for the month of \$35 per ounce was reached. The average price in Canadian funds for March was computed at \$35.08 per ounce; in February the average was \$35.29 per ounce.

The world output of gold in March was recorded at 2,057,000 ounces as against 1,919,000 ounces in February. Production in the Transvaal in March totalled 874,000 ounces; in the preceding month 826,000 ounces were produced. The United States output (including the Philippines) advanced to 226,760 ounces from the February total of 176,501 ounces. The United States March production consisted of 132,490 ounces received by private smelters and refiners, 93,222 ounces received at the Mint and 1,048 ounces contained in ore and base bullion exported.
