GOLD PRODUCTION IN CANADA, JULY, 1934.

Gold production in Canada during July was recorded at 245,516 ounces, an advance of 1.2 per cent over the June output of 242,713 ounces, but a decline of 4.3 per cent from the July, 1933, total of 256,663 ounces, according to a report just issued by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics at Ottawa. During the seven months ending July Canada produced 1,679,326 ounces of new gold as compared with 1,720,397 ounces in the corresponding months of 1933.

Production from Ontario mines in July totalled 171,654 ounces, consisting of 83,013 ounces from the Kirkland Lake area, 76,042 ounces from the Porcupine camp and 12,599 ounces from other sources. The June output was 169,445 ounces made up of 85,592 ounces from the Kirkland Lake area, 73,566 ounces from the Porcupine camp and 10,287 ounces from other sources. Ontario gold mining companies treated 534,541 tons of ore in July as against 516,731 tons in June and 462,635 tons in July, 1933.

Quebec's production advanced 5.1 per cent to 31,007 ounces from the June output of 29,512 ounces.

British Columbia produced 25,578 ounces as against 30,861 ounces in the preceding month.

The July gold production from Manitoba and Saskatchewan sources amounted to 11,124 ounces; in June 5,471 ounces were produced and in May, 10,527 ounces.

Alluvial gold production in the Yukon totalled 5,727 ounces, a decline of 19.6 per cent from the June output of 7,127 ounces.

Nove Scotia and Alberta produced 426 ounces of gold in July as compared with 297 ounces in the preceding month.

Receipts of jewellery and scrap at the Royal Canadian Mint in July contained 5,856 ounces of gold; the June receipts contained 5,195 ounces. During the first seven months of 1934 the gold content of jewellery and scrap receipts at the Mint reached a total of 92,876 ounces.

Quotations for gold on the New York market, in Canadian funds, averaged \$34.59 per ounce in July, at which price the month's output was worth \$8,492,398.

The world output of gold in July advanced to 2,229,000 ounces from the June total of 2,190,000 ounces. Production in the Transvaal rose to 876,000 ounces from the preceding month's output of 861,000 ounces. The United States (including the Philippines) produced 250,308 ounces, made up of 141,910 ounces contained in Mint receipts, 106,405 ounces received at private smelters and refineries and 1,993 ounces contained in ore and bullion exports.
