COLD PRODUCTION IN CANADA - SEPTEMBER, 1935.

Canada produced 280,362 sunces of gold in September as compared with 294,361 ounces in the preceding month and 344,777 ounces in September, 1934, according to a statement just issued by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics at Ottawa. During the nine months ending September the Canadian output of gold totalled 2,378,272 ounces, an increase of 8.4 per cent over the production in the corresponding period of 1934.

Production in Ontario during September amounted to 181,592 ounces consisting of 76,874 curces from the Kirkland Lake area, 75,806 curces from the Porcupine camp and 28,912 curces from other sources. During august 193,266 curces were produced, of which the Forcupine comp contributed 83,301 ounces, the Kirkland Lake area, 82,148 cunces, and other sources, 27,757 ounces.

Quebec operators produced 42,231 ownces or 1 per cent above the output in the preceding month.

British Columbia's production declined to 34,677 ounces from the August total of 38,459 ounces. This falling-off was due, in the main part, to the closing down, on August 23rd, of the Granby Consolidated Mining, Smelting & Power Company's smelter at Lnyox.

Manitoba and Saskatchewan sources accounted for an output of 13,583 ounces; this represented an increase of 4.8 per cent over the August production of 12,965 ounces. The mill of a new Manitoha producer, the God's Lake Gold Mines Ltd., commenced operations on September 15th. The September figures include, for the first time, production by the Forty Four Mines, Ltd. This company's mill was turned over on August 1st.

The Yukon's alluvial gold production in September was recorded at 7,599 ounces as against 7,208 ounces in August.

Shipments of gold from Nova Scotia mines in September were reported at 668 ounces; in August 660 ounces were shipped.

Jewellery and scrap receipts at the Royal Canadian Mint during September contained 3,149 ounces of gold. Receipts of this material during the first nine months of 1935 contained 35,459 ounces of gold.

Gold quotations, in Canadian funds, on the New York market averaged \$35.28 per ounce; valued at this price the Canadian output in September was worth \$9,891,171. In August the average price was \$25.09 per ounce and the value of the month's production was \$10,329,127.
