MONTHLY REPORT

GOLD PRODUCTION IN CANADA - JULY, 1937.

Gold production in Canada during July advanced to 347,474 ounces from the preceding month's total of 344,895 ounces and the July, 1936, output of 321,107 ounces, according to a statement just issued by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics at Ottava. Production during the first seven months of 1937 aggregated 2,320,725 ounces as compared with 2,096,815 ounces, a year ago.

Ontario's output during July totalled 219,934 ounces and consisted of 95,237 ounces from the Porcupine camp, 35,517 ounces from the Kirkland Lake area and 39,180 ounces from other sources. In June, the Porcupine camp produced 92,454 ounces, the Kirkland Lake area, 85,783 ounces, and other sources, 42,313 ounces.

Quebec operators reported an output of 58,785 ounces; in June, 55,111 ounces were produced. Production in this province during the seven morths ending July increased 6.3 per cent over the output for the corresponding months of 1936; the totals were 399,251 ounces and 375,602 ounces, respectively.

A 3.5 per cent decline was recorded in British Columbia's output; the July total was 40,739 ounces and the June total, 42,201 ounces.

Manitoba and Saskatchewan produced 20,141 ounces of gold; in the previous month 20,752 ounces were produced.

Alluvial and lode gold production in the Yukon amounted to 6,417 ounces in July as against 5,620 ounces in June and 7,513 ounces in July, 1933.

The Royal Canadian Mint received 1,458 ounces of gold from Nova Scotia producers in July as against 1,639 ounces in June and 1,380 ounces in July, a year ago.

Gold averaged \$35.05 per ounce, in Canadian funds, on the New York market in July; at this price the month's production was worth \$12,178,964. The June average price was \$35.02 and the value of the month's output was \$12,078,223.

The gold content of receipts of jewellery and scrap at the Royal Capadian Mint in July was 1,720 ounces as compared with 2,024 ounces in the preceding month.

The American Bureau of Metal Statistics estimates the world output of gold in July at 3,151,000 ownces or 2.9 per cent above the June production. South Africa produced 997,000 ownces in July as against 275,000 ownces in the previous month. Output in the United States advanced 14.1 per cent to 424,868 ownces and consisted of Mint receipts, 216,321 ownces, receipts at private smelters and refiners, 202,872 ownces, and the gold content of exports of ore and base bullion, 5,875 ownces.
