The Dominion Bureau of Statistics at Ottawa reports that the Canadian output of gold in July set up a new high monthly record at 456,626 ounces. In June, 451,277 ounces were produced while in July, a year ago, 439,925 ounces were produced. During the calendar year to date, Canada produced 3,028,668 ounces compared with 2,929,834 ounces in the period January to July, 1939.

The Ontario output in July encunted to 279,693 ounces, of which 122,153 ounces were obtained from the Porcupine camp, 80,331 ounces from the Kirkland Lake area and 68,200 ounces from other sources. The Porcupine camp produced 117,890 ounces in June, the Kirkland Lake area, 91,176 ounces, and other sources, 65,638 ounces.

A decline of 1.1 per cent was recorded in the Quebec output in July when 80,506 ounces were produced. The output in this province during the first seven months aggregated 577,839 ounces or 3.4 per cent above the output a year ago.

British Columbia operators reported an output of 53,285 ounces; in June, 56,807 ounces were produced. During the seven months ending July, production in this province totalled 346,160 ounces.

Manitoba and Saskatchewan producers extracted 21,563 ounces as against 21,340 ounces in the previous month.

Alluvial and lode gold production in the Yukon amounted to 9,972 ounces in July; in June, 9,955 ounces were produced while in July, a year ago, the cutput was 17,560 ounces.

In the Northwest Territories, production totalled 4,507 ounces as against 4,078 ounces in June; during the year to date, the output aggregated 29,312 ounces.

Nova Scotia operators shipped 2,111 ounces of gold in July compared with 3,015 ounces in June; thus making the total shipments to the end of July, this year, 14,602 ounces.

The Royal Canadian Mint received in July, in addition to new gold, 1,864 crude ounces of jewellery and scrap containing 698 ounces of gold.
