MONTHLY REPORT

GOLD PRODUCTION IN CANADA - JUNE, 1941.

Gold production in Canada during June amounted to 453,987 ounces compared with 449,185 ounces in the preceding month and 451,964 ounces in June, 1940, according to a report just issued by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics at Ottawa.

Ontario producers reported an output of 268,100 ounces in June, made up of 116,691 ounces from the Porcupine field, 85,276 ounces from the Kirkland Lake area and 66,133 ounces from other sources. During June, 1940, the Ontario production consisted of 117,829 ounces from the Porcupine field, 91,176 ounces from the Kirkland Lake area and 65,957 ounces from other sources.

Quebec's output in June totalled 87,591 ounces or 2.6 per cent below the previous month's production. In June, 1940, this province produced 81,511 ounces.

British Columbia produced 55,047 ounces of gold in June as against 49,927 ounces in May and 56,992 ounces in June, 1940.

Manitoba and Saskatchewan operators reported an output of 27,078 ounces in June; a year ago, 21,407 ounces were produced.

Production in the Northwest Territories amounted to 4,785 ounces; this represented an increase of 16.7 per cent over the June total of 4,102 ounces.

Shipments of gold from Nova Scotia mines to the Royal Canadian Mint in June totalled 1,622 ounces compared with 3,015 ounces a year ago.

Alluvial gold production from Yukon amounted to 9,733 ounces or 2.2 per cent below the June 1940 output of 9,955 ounces.

Receipts of jewellery and scrap at the Royal Canadian Mint in June contained 858 ounces of gold; a year ago the gold content of these receipts was 1,013 ounces.
