## CUID RRODUCTION IIT CATADA - JAMUARY: 1942

Cold production in Canada during Jamary; 1942 was recorded at 405,664 mances compared with 421,316 ounces in December, 1941 and 434,259 ounces in January, 1941, accordins to a report just issued by the Dominion Bureeu of Statistics at ottewa.

Ontario produced 223,912 ounces of gold in January, 1942 made up of 118,282 ounces f:゙ors the Porcupine Camp, 47,293 ounces from the Kirkland Lake field and 58,337 ounces from other sources. During Jamuery, 1941 Onterio's output was 267,668 bunces, consisting of 120,403 ounces from the Porcupine cemp, 79,987 ounces from the Firkland Lake field and 67,273 oumes from other sources.

Quebec roports an output of 99,825 ounces on 11.1 per cent above the Jemery, $194 \pi$ total of 89,660 ounces, and 1.0 per cent above the December, 1941 totel of 97,594 .

British columbje produced 45,375 ounces compared with 47,898 ounces in December anc 47,:496 ounces in Januery, 1941.

Wenitobe end Seskatchewn produced 24,976 cunces in Jemury; this represented in increcse of 1.2 per cent over the Januery, 1941 totel of 21,790 ounces.

In the Northwest Territories production enounted to 8,023 ounces in Jenuary, 1942 and 4,530 ounces for the same month a yens rgo.
