## MONTHLY REPORT

## GOLD PRODUCTION IN CANADA, MARCH, 1945

Gold production during March, 1945 totalled 228,687 fine ounces compared with 266,644 fine ounces in March, 1944 and 212,351 fine ounces in February, 1945. The value of the March, 1945 gold production was \$8,804,450.

Of the total gold production for March, 1945, 188,669 fine ounces came from auriferous quartz mines and alluvial deposits, and 40,018 fine ounces originated in base metal mines.

Gold produced in auriferous quartz mines and placers decreased 14.4 per cent in March, 1945 as compared with the production from the corresponding sources in March, 1944. Production of gold from base metal mines dropped 13.7 per cent in a comparison of the same periods.

Employees in producing auriferous quartz mines, including both salaried employees and wage-earners, numbered 15,298 in March, 1945; the corresponding total for active non-producing mines was 815. Employees in non-ferrous metal mines, smelters and refineries totalled 34,501.
