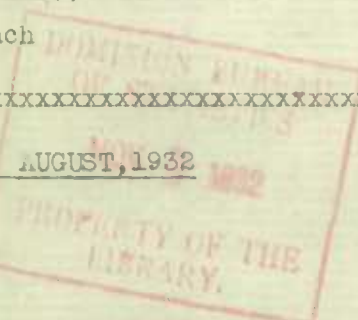


DOMINION BUREAU OF STATISTICS - CANADA
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PETROLEUM AND NATURAL GAS PRODUCTION IN CANADA, AUGUST, 1932
and
GASOLINE SALES IN CANADA, JUNE, 1932.

PETROLEUM - Crude petroleum production in Canada during August totalled 85,229 barrels, a 2.0 per cent decline from the July output of 86,969 barrels and 17.5 per cent from the August, 1931, total of 103,314 barrels, according to a report issued by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics at Ottawa. Production during the first eight months of 1932 amounted to 737,767 barrels as compared with 1,177,060 barrels in the corresponding period of 1931.

In August, wells in Alberta produced 72,896 barrels made up of 68,696 barrels of crude naphtha and 1,013 barrels of light crude from the Turner Valley field, 2,442 barrels of light crude from the Red Coulee field, and 745 barrels of heavy crude from the Wainwright field.

Canada imported petroleum, asphalt and their products to a value of \$4,780,511 in August as compared with the July valuation of \$4,946,492. During August the United States supplied 76.3 per cent of the total importations, Peru, 8.7 per cent, Colombia, 6.8 per cent, Trinidad, 4.2 per cent, Venezuela, 2.5 per cent, and the Dutch West Indies, Great Britain, Mexico, India, Germany, Belgium, Sweden, Roumania, Norway and Newfoundland, the remainder. Imports of crude petroleum declined 13.8 per cent to 89,776,589 gallons as against the July total of 104,209,139 gallons. The August importations of crude oil included 67,306,576 gallons from the United States, 8,182,423 gallons from Colombia, 7,611,101 gallons from Peru, 5,721,129 gallons from Venezuela and 955,360 gallons from Trinidad.

In the United States the daily allowance per well in the East Texas field was reduced to 44 barrels for the first half of August, a further reduction to 43 barrels was made for the second half of the month. At the end of August 7,750 wells were producing in this field.

GASOLINE - Consumption of gasoline in Canada during June amounted to 51,174,322 gallons as compared with 47,320,726 gallons in May and 55,544,000 gallons in June, 1931.

Casinghead gasoline imported into Canada in June totalled 2,812,792 gallons valued at \$184,643. Gasoline lighter than .6235 specific gravity at 60° temperature imports were recorded at 6,939,429 gallons at \$637,427; the United States supplied 99.9 per cent of this gasoline.

The following data have been compiled by the Transportation Branch of the Dominion Bureau of Statistics from reports received from the provincial government departments administering the Gasoline Tax Act.

NATURAL GAS - Production of natural gas in Canada in August was reported at 911,982 thousand cubic feet, a 7.1 per cent decline from the previous month's total of 981,700 thousand cubic feet and 29.8 per cent from the August, 1931, production of 1,299,165 thousand cubic feet.

Mixed gas (natural and artificial) imports in August were recorded at 7,768 thousand cubic feet worth \$6,113, in July 7,065 thousand cubic feet valued at \$5,610 were imported.
