GASOLINE - Gasoline ^{sales} statistics for January are not yet available for Nova Scotia, Quebec, Saskatchewan and British Columbia. Prince Edward Island sales of gasoline in January were reported at 21,000 gallons as compared with 84,000 gallons a year ago. In New Brunswick 208,000 gallons were sold; in January, 1933, sales totalled 503,000 gallons. Ontario's total in January, 1934, was 13,564,000 gallons; a year ago 15,830,000 gallons were sold. Sales in Manitoba were recorded at 990,000 gallons or 15.0 per cent above the January, 1933, total of 861,000 gallons. Alberta's records showed sales of 1,761,000 gallons in January; a year ago 1,887,000 gallons were sold.

Imports of natural casinghead gasoline into Canada totalled 1,987,904 gallons at \$111,013; in the preceding month 4,771,648 gallons worth \$400,786 were imported and in January, 1933, importations amounted to 1,104,155 gallons at \$56,417. Gasoline lighter than .8235 specific gravity at 60° temperature imports in January were recorded at 653,314 gallons with a valuation of \$69,350 as compared with the December total of 795,244 gallons at \$82,938 and the January, 1933, imports of 1,247,078 gallons worth \$107,703.
