## PETROLEUM AND NATURAL GAS PRODUCTION IN CANADA, JUNE, 1934

and

## GASOLINE SALES IN CANADA, MAY, 1934.

CRUDE PETROLEUM - The Dominion Bureau of Statistics at Ottawa reports that the Canadian output of crude petroleum during June amounted to 109,021 barrels as compared with 117,693 barrels in the preceding month and 114,380 barrels in June, 1933. Petroleum production during the first six months of 1934 totalled 716,621 barrels or 34.4 per cent above the output in the corresponding months of 1933.

During June, Alberta produced 95,820 barrels, consisting of 91,369 barrels of crude naphtha and 1,555 barrels of light crude oil from the Turner Valley field, 1,682 barrels of light crude oil from the Red Coulee field and 1,214 barrels of heavy crude oil from the Wainwright field.

Canada imported petroleum, asphalt and their products to a value of \$4,469,070 in June as against \$4,075,327 in May. The June imports were obtained from the following countries: the United States, 75.2 per cent; Colombia, 18.4 per cent; Peru, 3.1 per cent; Trinidad, 1.4 per cent; Venezuela, 1.2 per cent, and India, Great Britain, Germany, France, Alaska, Sweden and Belgium, the remainder. Importations of crude petroleum during June were recorded at 114,880,249 gallons made up of 76,964,497 gallons from the United States, 28,749,287 gallons from Colombia, 4,533,923 gallons from Peru, 2,535,470 gallons from Venezuela and 2,097,072 gallons from Trinidad.


Exports of petroleum and its products from Canada in June were valued at \$234,164; in the preceding month the export value was \$155,584.

The average daily output of crude petroleum and natural gas/in the United States during June was 2,770,000 barrels or 94,000 barrels above the May total. Production during June exceeded the federal allowable by approximately 142,000 barrels per day. The East Texas field was the principal source of the June overproduction.


NATURAL GAS - Natural gas production in Canada during June reached a total of 1,142,526 thousand cubic feet as compared with 1,442,521 thousand cubic feet in May and 1,127,681 thousand cubic feet in June, 1933.

Imports of mixed gas (natural and artificial) into Canada in June amounted to 5,962 thousand cubic feet worth \$4,024; in May, 8,923 thousand cubic feet valued at \$5,794 were imported.

GASOLINE - No data are as yet available on gasoline sales in Manitoba during May. Statistics for the other consuming provinces are shown in the table on page 3.

Imports of casinghead gasoline into Canada during May totalled 6,118,140 gallons appraised at \$343,522 as against 1,732,252 gallons at \$57,221 imported in April. Receipts of gasoline lighter than .8235 specific gravity at 600 temperature rose to 1,125,337 gallons worth \$105,950 from the April total of 625,465 gallons at \$53,540.
