PETROLEUM AND NATURAL GAS PRODUCTION IN CANADA, MARCH, 1936.

and

GASOLINE SALES IN CANADA, MARCH, 1936.

CRUDE PETROLEUM - Canada produced 117,824 barrels of crude petroleum during March as compared with 107,928 barrels produced in the preceding month and 120,537 barrels in March, 1935, according to a statement just issued by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics at Ottawa. During the first quarter of 1936 the Canadian output totalled 346,983 barrels; this represented an increase of 2.7 per cent over the output in the corresponding period of 1935.

The March production from Alberta sources amounted to 101,857 barrels made up of 97,726 barrels of crude naphtha and 1,249 barrels of light crude oil from the Turner Valley field, 2,020 barrels of light crude oil from the Red Coulee field, 732 barrels and 130 barrels of heavy crude oil from the Wainwright and Skiff fields, respectively.

Exports of petroleum and its products from Canada in March were valued at \$25,167 as against the preceding month's valuation of \$12,571.

The value of the Canadian imports of petroleum, asphalt and their products in March was recorded at \$3,008,511; in February the import valuation was \$1,552,812. The March importations were obtained from the following countries: the United States, 79.1 per cent; Peru, 16.6 per cent; Colombia, 3.6 per cent, and India, Germany, Mexico, Great Britain, France, Switzerland, Belgium, Sweden, Japan and Norway, the remainder. Imports of crude petroleum into Canada in March consisted of 51,403,028 gallons from the United States, 10,028,708 gallons from Peru and 3,951,463 gallons from Colombia.

Crude oil and natural gasoline production in the United States during March reached a total of 2,975,000 barrels per day. Wells in the Texas field produced 34,840,000 barrels during the month or 620,000 barrels above their quota. California produced 17,560,000 barrels in March; this was 840,000 barrels in excess of the Bureau of Mines quota. Oklahoma's output was recorded at 15,990,000 barrels which was 290,000 barrels higher than the month's quota. Louisiana produced 6,160,000 barrels and Kansas, 4,610,000 barrels; these totals represented overproduction of 1,470,000 barrels and 210,000 barrels, respectively.

NATURAL GAS - The Canadian production of natural gas in March amounted to 2,838,626 thousand cubic feet; in February, 4,011,882 thousand cubic feet were produced while in March, 1935, the output was 2,665,693 thousand cubic feet. Production during the three months ending March aggregated 10,349,600 thousand cubic feet or 17.4 per cent above the output in the first quarter of 1935.

Customs' records show the importation into Canada of 18,079 thousand cubic feet of mixed gas (natural and artificial) worth \$11,237 in March as compared with 9,466 thousand cubic feet at \$6,595 imported in February.
