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## MCNTHLY REPORT

PETROLEUM IND NATURAL GAS PRODUCTION AND GASCLINE SALES IN CANADA - JANUARY, 1937.

CRUIE P TROLEUM - The Dominion Bureau of Statistics at Ottawa reports that the Canadian production of crude petroleum in J nuary am unted to 141,078 barrels as compared with 139,701 barrels in December and 121,231 barrels in January, 1936.

Production from Alberta sources in January totalled 127,977 barrels, made up of 125,714 barrels from the Turner Valley field, 1,022 barrels from the Red Coulee field and 1,241 barrels from the Wainwright field. Te Alberta output during Doce ber was recorded at 124,979 barrels.

The value of the exports of petroleum and its products in January advanced to \$154,569 from the December total of \$43,955.

Canada imported petroleum, asphalt and their products to a value of \$2,242,835 in January as compared with the preceding month's total of \$2,740,686. The January importations were obtained from the following countries: the United States, 82.4 per cent; Peru, 16.5 per cent; India, 0.6 per cent and Germany, Great Britain, Switzerland, Belgium, Sweden and Japan, the remainder. Crude petroleum importations during January totalled 54,709,437 gallons and consisted of 48,472,809 gallons from the United States and 6,236,628 gallons from Peru.

NATURAL G.S - Natural gas production in Canada during January totalled 3,822,291 thousand cubic feet as compared with 3,055,635 thousand cubic feet in the preceding month and 3,499,092 thousand cubic feet in January, 1936, according to a statement just issued by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics at Ottawa.

Mixed gas (natural and artificial) imported into Canada in January amounted to 7,600 thousand cubic feet valued at \$5,543; in the previous month 9,382 thousand cubic feet worth \$5,629 were imported.
