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## MONTHLY REPORT

## PETROLEUM AND NATURAL GAS PRODUCTION LND GISOLINE SIIES IN CLNADA, MiY, 1937.

CRUDE PEITROLEUM - Crude potroieum and natural gasoline production in Canada during May amounted to 192,845 berrels as compared with 288,014 barrels in 4pril and 114,297 barrels in May, 1936, according to a statement just issued by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics at Ottewa. Output during the five months ending May aggregated 852,500 barrels; this represented an increase of 49.8 per cent over the production in the corresponding period of 1936 .
f.lberta produced 175,997 barrels in Way as against 172,608 barrels in the preceding month and $98, r 8 y$ berrels in Nay, a year ago. The May, 1937 output included 173,672 barrols from the Tumer Velley field, 1,211 barrels from the Red Coulee field and 1,114 barrels from the Weinwright ficla.

Petroleum and its products exported from Canada in May wore valued at $\$ 87,049$; the previous month's export valuation was $\$ 28,557$.

Imports of petroloum, asphalt and a...... products into Canada in May were appraised at $\$ 5,435,440,0 』$ which 69.6 per cont came from the United States, 12.3 per cent from Colombia, 11.3 per cent from Peru, 5.9 per cent from Venezuela and the remainder from other countrios. In ipril, the Canadicr imports were worth $\$ 2,701,215$. Receipts of crude petroleum during May consisted of $5 \% .44,064$ gallons from the United States, 21,884,045 gailons from Colombia; 16,224,846 gailons from Venezuela and $13,086,565$ gallons from Peru.

NaTURAL GhS - Vatural gas production in Canada during May amounted to
1,759,878 thousand cubic feet; in April, 2,254,401 thousand cubic feet were produced, while in May, a year ago, 1,784,601 thousand cubic feet were produced. During the five months ending May, the Canadian output totalled $13,795,588$ thousand cubic feet; a year ago, 14,431,382 thousand cubic feet were produced.

Customs" records show that 7,845 thousand cubic feet worth $\$ 5,121$ were
imported in May as compared with 21,462 thousand cubic feet at $\$ 7,282$ in April.
