Chief - Mining, Metallurgical and Chemical Branch: W. H. Losee, B. Sc.MONTHLY REPORTPETROLEUM AND NATURAL GAS PRODUCTION AND GASOLINE SALES IN CANADA, JUNE, 1937.

CRUDE PETROLEUM - The Dominion Bureau of Statistics at Ottawa reports that the Canadian production of crude petroleum and natural gasoline advanced to a new high monthly record of 209,181 barrels from the preceding month's total of 192,845 barrels. In June, 1936, the output was 114,050 barrels. During the first six months of 1937, Canada produced 1,061,681 barrels; this represented an increase of 55.4 per cent over the production a year ago.

Operators in Alberta produced 191,634 barrels in June as compared with 175,997 barrels in May and 97,639 barrels in June, 1936. Output during the month under review included 189,411 barrels from the Turner Valley field, 1,115 barrels from the Red Coulee field and 1,108 barrels from the Wainwright-Ribstone field. The month of June witnessed the continued successful use of acid to increase the output of the Turner Valley wells. The success attained by acidizing is amply proven by the 99.9 per cent output advance during the month as compared with the total for June, 1936. Production from the Ribstone field was resumed on a small scale in June with the report of output from the Dina well.

Exports of petroleum and its products from Canada in June were valued at \$109,841 as against the preceding month's export valuation of \$87,049.

Petroleum, asphalt and their products imported into Canada in June were appraised at \$6,377,569; the May imports were worth \$5,435,440. Crude petroleum imports in June consisted of 120,606,238 gallons from the United States, 16,162,385 gallons from Colombia, 10,447,333 gallons from Venezuela and 10,302,326 gallons from Peru.

NATURAL GAS - The Canadian production of natural gas in June was recorded at 1,340,699 thousand cubic feet as compared with 1,759,878 thousand cubic feet in May and 1,377,373 thousand cubic feet in June, 1936. During the first six months of 1937, Canada produced 15,136,287 thousand cubic feet; a year ago, 15,808,755 thousand cubic feet were produced.

Imports of mixed gas (natural and artificial) into Canada in June amounted to 9,318 thousand cubic feet worth \$6,012; during May, 7,845 thousand cubic feet at \$5,121 were imported.
